United Through Reading (UTR) offers military service members who are away from home the opportunity to be video-recorded reading storybooks to the children in their lives, creating positive emotional connections.

Our Service to Military Families

UTR is available to all military branches and units including the Coast Guard and all Reserve components. UTR is also hosted at select USO sites and has served nearly two million beneficiaries since 1989. The UTR program:

- Cultivates a love of reading


Steps to Staying Connected

1 The service member is video-recorded reading a book and sends the video home. 2 The child at home watches the

video and follows along with the book. 3 While the child watches, the caregiver at home captures the child's reaction and relates it back to the service member. 4 This feedback encourages the service member to record again.
