Tim Farrell, CEO, United Through Reading (Incoming)

Tim Farrell is the Chief Executive Officer of United Through Reading. He served as an American Airman for more than 23 years, and is a veteran of Operations DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, IRAQI FREEDOM and NEW DAWN. Tim retired from the U.S. Air Force in September 2011 after his final deployment as the Commander of the 332nd Expeditionary Security Forces Group at Joint Base Balad, Iraq.

Though "retired" from the Air Force, Tim stays just a little bit busier than that. Besides leading United Through Reading, Tim's decade-plus of nonprofit leadership currently includes service as a trustee of the World Affairs Council of San Antonio, and as a Texas State Leader and one of the "Veterans for Smart Power" within the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition.

Tim previously served as Chief Operating Officer of MCEC – the Military Child Education Coalition, and Operation Homefront; Chief Executive Officer of NAVSO – The National Association of Veteran-Serving Organizations; a City Council-confirmed appointee to the City of San Antonio's Veterans Affairs Commission; and as the chair of the board of directors of Students of Service (SOS) – San Antonio.

Tim holds a bachelor's degree from Rutgers University, a master's degree from Central Michigan University, and an executive certificate in transformational nonprofit leadership from the University of Notre Dame. But more importantly, he's Gina's husband, Aidan and Keagan's dad, and grateful for his continued opportunities to serve.

Maggie Worthington loves being involved in her special forces military spouse community, currently serving as the Fleet Readiness Group (FRG) president and ombudsman to her spouse's command. As a Navy Seal, her husband spouse, Chief Petty Officer Rhodes Worthington deploys frequently as a Navy Seal, leaving Maggie with their two daughters, Madeline, six, and Mackenzie, one.

While serving on the FRG, Maggie became aware of United Through Reading. "It's made a huge difference in our lives," Maggie says of the program. "We use it all the time."

The Worthington kids love watching videos of their dad and hearing his voice while he's deployed, especially since both girls love reading. "My 1.5 year old loves books," says Maggie. "That's one of the only words she can say: book, book." She continued that the videos are especially helpful with her toddler because they allow Mackenzie to hear her dad's voice and feel that they have a connection without using video chats, which can be difficult for tots to use and understand.

Maggie's older daughter, Madeline, also benefits from the videos. "My 6-year-old has a very hard time when her daddy is leaving," says Maggie. "It's huge for her to have that connection to him and hear his voice still while he's gone."

MILITARY GUESTS OF HONOR

VADM Kenneth Whitesell, USN & Mrs. Melodye Whitesell Commander, Naval Air Forces Commander, Naval Air Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet

Vice Adm. Kenneth Whitesell is a native of Stuarts Draft, Virginia, and a 1983 graduate of Old Dominion University with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering. He received his commission from Aviation Officer Candidate School in February 1985 and earned his naval aviation wings in October 1986. He is a graduate of the Joint Forces Staff College and the Naval War College with a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies.

Whitesell's operational assignments include Fighter Squadron (VF) 142, USS Eisenhower (CVN 69); Top Gun training officer and assistant operations officer with VF-74, USS Saratoga (CV 60); and VF-32, USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71). He transitioned from the F-14 Tomcat into the F/A-18F Super Hornet and commanded Strike Fighter Squadron (VFA) 41, USS Nimitz (CVN 68). His major command tour included commander, Carrier Air Wing 1, USS Enterprise (CVN 65). Most recently, he served as commander, Carrier Strike Group 2 aboard USS George H.W. Bush (CVN 77).

Whitesell's shore assignments include tactics phase leader with VF-101, F-14 Fleet Replacement Squadron (FRS); assistant readiness officer, Commander, Fighter Wing Atlantic; a joint tour as strategic action officer, National Military Command Center, Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington, D.C.; executive officer, VFA-122 during the fleet transition to the FA-18 E/F Super Hornet; and as the tactical air (TACAIR) commander detailer and head assignments officer, Navy Personnel Command; and most recently deputy commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet, in July 2019.

He completed overseas tours as Combined Air and Space Operations Center battle director, Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar; and chief of staff and director, Maritime Operations Center, Commander, U.S. Navy Central Command/Commander, U.S. 5th Fleet. He also served as the director, Aviation Officer Distribution Division, PERS-43, Navy Personnel Command. As a flag officer, he served as the assistant commander, Navy Personnel Command for Career Management (PERS-4).Whitesell became Naval Aviation's ninth "Air Boss" on October 2, 2020. Whitesell has participated in Operations Desert Shield, Southern Watch, Deliberate Guard/Allied Force, Iraqi Freedom and Inherent Resolve. He has accumulated over 4,000 flight hours and 1,005 carrier arrested landings.

His personal decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit (five awards), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), Air Medal, and various campaign, unit and individual awards.

CS2(SW) Robert Franklin "Frankie" Hard, III, USN, shares his most memorable moment as a United Through Reading volunteer:

"I would say that out of all of my memories of assisting families with recording. The most memorable was assisting an active duty mother, whose husband was deployed on the USS Lincoln as it shifted homeports from Norfolk, Virginia to San Diego, CA. She had her four children with her and shared that it had been over ten months since they had seen him. She told me how stressful it was and how much they all missed him. She asked me if she could go into the Mobile Story Station and read a book alone. I sat outside with her children, and she went in there and read a few books for each of them. When she came out, she thanked me for watching her children and providing her the opportunity to read each of them a book and tell them how much she loves and misses them. She stated that once her husband got home, she would soon deploy and that those recordings would be left with her husband so that when she is gone, they will be able to watch them."

He added, "That brief moment shows how much sacrifice that military families have to endure, and dual-military parents sacrifice even more. It also showed that the simplest gesture allows military members to stay connected through reading and creates everlasting memories."
